#### Call to Order

Governor Cara Wilton leads the Key Club Pledge. Division 12/22 Lt. Governor Madison Green leads the invocation- a moment of silence. District Secretary Kareena Patel takes a roll call in order to document all persons in attendance.

#### **Welcome & Code of Conduct Reminders**

District Administrator Kenyon Black welcomes everyone to the 2019 Summer Board meeting and begins by reminding the board on the District Code of Conduct. Reminders:

- Be respectful and discuss in all matters.

#### Resignations, Removals, and Appointments

Governor Ashna Patel announces all of the resignations by stating their names and positions: Resignations

Division 2N Lt. Governor Jennifer Nguyen motioned to accept these resignations, seconded by Division 3C Lt. Governor Rujul Kulkarni, and the motion passed.

Governor Ashna Patel announces all of the removals by stating their names and positions: Removals

#### **Governor Goals and Expectations**

Governor Ashna Patel points out the importance of professionalism and time management. She reminds Lieutenant Governors to remain professional at all times, including the board room, LTG club visits, social media and in public. She mentioned that she has seen some issues within the board on social media unprofessionalism. Social media professionalism needs to be maintained at all times because as an LTG, you are representing Texas-Oklahoma District. Governor Patel also warns LTGs we might have to appoint someone to check social media, but she doesn't want to do that. Governor Patel states that time management is key. She gives tips to manage time because as a board member, everyone will get stressed. Governor Ashna Patel gives a positive encouragement talk. She ends by saying, "If you are drowning in stress, yell for help!"

#### Parli Pro Review

Region 12 Advisor Megan Iselin welcomes everyone to their first board meeting. She states that later tonight the entire District Board will take a test over Parliamentary Procedures, bylaws, and the codes. She announced that the test has free-response, multiple choice and short answers and is 8 pages long. She reminds everyone that more than half the board will fail. The test will focus on things that might slip out of your mind. She encouraged the board members to take complete advantage of their study time to review the bylaws and codes once more. She notified the board that the test will be curved either up or down based on how everyone does.

Region 12 Advisor Megan Iselin opened the floor for any questions.

Division 12/22 Lt. Governor Madison Greene asked if there is anything in specific we needed to know on the bylaws.

Region 12 Advisor Megan Iselin then answered that the majority of the test will be over bylaws and codes so make sure you have looked over that.

#### **Bylaw and Parliamentary Procedure Test**

The entire board took the test over the bylaws, code of conduct, code of elections and HOD and parliamentary procedures. They had 30 minutes to complete.

After the completion of the test, Region 12 Advisor Megan Iselin asks for feedback on the test.

Majority of the board said the test was easier than what most people said, and the questions were directly from the materials told to read and study. They also agree that the Rules, Elections and Credentials Committee's study guide materials tremendously helped them out.

District Treasurer Katherine Chao motions for a 10-minute recess, seconded by Division 16 Lt. Governor Natalie Delatorre and motion passes.

The Board reconvened at 8:07 pm.

#### LTG Monthly Reports

Governor Ashna Patel mentions that the average of the report card scores is based off the total time an LTG has served. She pointed out that more than half the board had an F. She emphasizes the board should be trying their best to excel, and she should see improvements by Winter Board. She gives the LTGs the opportunity to ask any questions they may have, or they can see her personally after the meeting.

#### **Regional Training Conferences**

Governor Ashna Patel states that Regional Training Conferences should already be in planning by now. RTCs need to be fun and informative. She informs LTGs to pick a date that works best for their entire region and try to accommodate so they can get as many people as possible. Be sure to give at least a 30 days advance notice to clubs. The content that needs to be produced is stated on the RFL guidelines. Governor Ashna Patel gave ideas on how to host a successful RTC.

Division 2N Lt. Governor Jennifer Nguyen asks what committee structure means.

Governor Ashna Patel responds that committee structure means the level of structures in Key Club.

Dallas Mavericks Harrison Butcher District Fundraiser
District Secretary Kareena Patel moves to amend the agenda to have the Dallas
Mavericks speak before DCM/PCMs, seconded by Division 30 Lt. Governor Desiree
Rickett, and the motion passes.

Harrison Butcher presented his fundraiser idea. The fundraiser entails of the Dallas Mavericks team partnering up with Key Club to sell tickets. Harrison says we could also have a website on which we can sell tickets to help raise money, and the District will take a portion of the profits. He goes over the various events that could be held. The board would have the responsibility to communicate with their clubs and try to sell tickets for the Dallas Maverick basketball games.

Division 2N Lt. Governor Jennifer Nguyen asked if there is a minimum amount of money that the clubs have to raise? Harrison replies no.

Division 40E Lt. Governor Macy Boren asks how can Oklahomans get involved? Harrison says the LTGs will need to spread the word amongst their Oklahoma clubs. Also, he proposes we could have a Thunder vs. Mavericks game in OKC to get their attention.

District Administrator Kenyon Black mentions he has been talking to Harrison for a while now and would love to partner up with the organization to help raise money for District Convention and our district.

Division 7/33 Lt. Governor Enrique Mata asked what is the best demographic range if the district does choose this project?

Harrison replied that there is no specific demographic so tickets can be sold to anyone that has an affiliation with basketball.

Division 30 Lt. Governor Desiree Rickett asked if there were any specific requirements for this fundraiser.

Harrison answered that the total amount raised would need to be about \$1500 and sell 100 tickets.

Division 12/22 Lt. Governor Madison Green asked if there was a specific code when they order a ticket off the website so that the district gets the money.

Division 18N Lt. Governor David Jeffalone asked if there were any incentives for clubs to participate.

Harrison replied that the only incentive is that they get to go watch a basketball game and a portion of their purchase will go towards the district funds.

District Administrator Kenyon points out that the board needs to think of this opportunity in a bigger and broader term. This is a chance for our district to raise funds for a better convention.

Division 12/22 Lt. Governor Madison Green says that she agrees we should adopt this idea because if we don't support it then it might hurt our District Convention.

Division 24S Lt. Governor Cara Wilton agrees by saying we should accept this because we are getting money and doing it in an easy way.

Various board members then continue to discuss the fundraiser.

Region 10 Advisor Kristina Jacobson says that this is the final time we will meet this year so we need to discuss and make a decision.

Division 39S Lt. Governor Sharlene Garcia asks if the organization is willing to partner up with Key Club just once or more often.

Harrison says he would love to do it more often.

Division 3C Lt. Governor Rujul Kulkarni asks if members would be required to purchase their own parking.

Harrison says yes they would still need to purchase their parking.

Governor Ashna Patel says that some clubs can't go to DCON because of the cost, so this is a great idea to get more clubs to DCON and make it more affordable.

Division 18S Lt. Governor Elie Lam says his home club isn't able to attend DCON because of the high costs. He asks if we take this idea, then would DCON registration fees be lower.

District Administrator Kenyon says no because we are already losing \$35 per person, so if we aren't raising funds then the price of registration is going to go up. He reminds everyone to look at the bigger picture.

Division 12/22 Lt. Governor Madison Green motions to accept this fundraiser, seconded by Division 18N Lt. Governor David Jeffalone and the motion passes.

#### DCMS/PCMs

Governor Ashna Patel remind Lieutenant Governors that they need to have atleast 10 DCMs in the year. The RFL requires them to have 5, but she urges them to do 1 every month with the exception of 2 months.

Division 12/22 Lt. Governor Madison Green asked if there is a specific format that has to be used for DCM minutes.

Governor Ashna Patel answered that there is a minutes format template under secretary resources which is generic for clubs that can be used.

#### **1st Round of Committee Meetings**

#### New policies/procedures/other information

A policy will be put in place for transgender to enforce inclusiveness.

District Assistant Administrator Kelly Poland reasserts that harassment is wrong. She warns the board to not wait out of fear and don't confront it alone. She advises the board to contact an adult about any possible harassment.

#### **District Project Committee Report & Voting**

Division 40E Lt. Governor and Chairwoman Macy Boren presents her goals for the District Project Committee this year. Her goals are:

Division 18N Lt. Governor Elie Lam asks Chairperson Macy Boren if the \$26,000 goal is too high to reach given that we are already asking for DCON sponsorships, and what will happen if we don't reach the goal.

Chairperson Macy Boren answers that the foundation will match with the amount we raise. We should aim to raise \$26,000 so that the scholarship is definite.

District Assistant Administrator Kelly Poland replies that if the money is not raised, then there will be no proprietary.

Division 30 Lt. Governor Desiree Rickett asks how we plan to get Kiwanians involved in T-O Cares.

Division 28 Lt. Governor Pranav asks if there are any specific times that Key Clubbers can go read for the Key Readers project.

Chairperson Macy Boren answers no. Everyone will be able to choose their own time to ensure the project is flexible for everyone.

Division 2C Lt. Governor Katherine Bui asked if there was going to be an International tie.

Chairperson Macy Boren replied that there could be. She hasn't thought of it yet, but if the majority wants it, then they can incorporate International in.

Division 8 Lt. Governor Kasandra Schroeder mentioned that her LTG project is caring for kids so she is willing to pair up.

Division 7/33 Lt. Governor Enrique Mata asks how the Itgs need to present this to Kiwanians.

Chairperson Macy Boren answers that she will create infographics and send them to LTGs so they can share them with their clubs.

Division 24S Lt. Governor Cara Wilton verifies that the scholarship is \$1,000 and the rest goes in the bank to gain interest, and the money will be raised by the district.

Division 18N Lt. Governor David Jeffalone asks if the public libraries that will be built by Kiwanis would just be in elementary schools or other grade levels as well.

Chairperson Macy Boren responds that it can be any grade levels.

Division 12/22 Lt. Governor Madison Green points out that every scholarship is endowed so we need to have more money so this scholarship can keep going as the years pass by.

Chairperson Macy Boren mentions that giving out this scholarship will mean so much to the family.

District Treasurer Katherine Chao points out that if we choose to do "Scholarship for Jose" then the total average per active club will be \$90 to raise.

Division 18N Lt. Governor Elie Lam asks if clubs and businesses will be recognized at DCON.

Chairperson Macy Boren says yes they will be recognized and receive patches and certificates. Gold and below sponsorships will receive certificates and platinum and above will receive patches.

Division 2N Lt. Governor Jennifer Nguyen motions to accept "Scholarship for Jose" as the District Project, seconded by Division 28 Lt. Governor Pranav Gupta.

Division 18N Lt. Governor Elie Lam states it might be very risk taking to do scholarships.

Division 12/22 Lt. Governor Madison points out that we are already losing money in the district, and we can commemorate Jose in another way.

Division 30 Lt. Governor Desiree Rickett mentions that we can have a moment of silence at DCON to show respect or we could just do our project over a span of a year or a few years instead of forever.

District Secretary Kareena Patel states that Key Club is about service and since we're already asking for money for DCON, it would be a better idea to focus on service. Key Reader is more accessible and will allow every club to get involved with the district project

District Secretary Kareena Patel motions to amend the previous motion by making the district project "Key Readers", seconded by Division 12/22 Lt. Governor Madison Green.

Division 34 Lt. Governor Marlon Castillo says we need to consider that we will be talking to those kids and could possibly be influencing them.

Division 2N Lt. Governor Jennifer Nguyen moves the previous question, seconded by Division 18N Lt. Governor David Jeffalone, and the motion passes.

#### **Budget Review and Approval**

District Assistant Administrator Ryan Edmoundson presented 2019-2020's budget to the board. The budget year starts October 1st. We have 112,000 to work with this year only with dues. District Convention budget is \$145,500. DCON registration costs are \$135 per person without all other accessories. Assistant Administrator Ryan Edmoundson mentioned that the convention prices will have to increase to ensure that we have a good convention because we are currently losing \$35 per attendee. The new convention price is \$160 for early registration and \$190 for late registration. He thoroughly goes over each aspect of the district budget, explaining where the money goes.

Division 40W Lt. Governor Hannah Vaught motions to approve the 2019-2020 budget, seconded by Division 30 Lt. Governor Desiree Rickett, and the motion passes.

Division 30 Lt. Governor Desiree Rickett motions to recess until 1:00 pm for lunch, seconded by Division 24S Lt. Governor Cara Wilton, and the motion passes.

Board reconvenes at 1:04 pm.

#### **Editor Update**

District Editor Vivian Thai gives an update over tips, expectations, LTG assignments and her work till date. She emphasized that her Jolly Book of Insight will be completed by the end of August. She went over her expectations from LTGs in terms of doing their newsletters and turning them in on time.

She then asked for tips that she could use to help club editors out.

Governor Ashna Patel also pointed out that District Editor Vivian Thai had sent out two Youtube tutorials in her past update so LTGs needed to look over those because they will answer a majority of their questions.

District Editor Vivian Thai concludes by giving the LTGs a link on which they can go grade the Tex-O-Key made by her and give it positive criticism. She wants to better her newsletters with this input from the board.

#### **District Convention Forums**

Convention Liaison Dillion Grisham shows a short video over our guest speaker. He goes over a list of the forums we will have at DCON. CL Grisham reminds the board to start brainstorming names for forums correlating with the theme.

#### **Youth Opportunities Fund**

District Treasurer Katherine Chao presents an update over the Youth Opportunities Fund. She explains how clubs can apply for the YOF grant and successfully get it. A club must be active to receive the grant. She goes over the timeline on the YOF. #### **1st Committee Reports**

Division 2C Lt. Governor and Chairperson Katherine Bui discusses what General Public Relations plans to promote this upcoming year.

They want to promote:

- Series of Governor Projects
- Set up reminders for events
- District Convention
- Fall Rally
- Re-inform rules

Chairperson Katherine Bui said they have made posts about where the resources would be located for clubs, established a calendar for posts and promoted trainings through social media. Through social media, they want to engage Key Club, remind everyone, and spread awareness of various events.

#### **Governor's Project Committee Update**

Division 18S Lt. Governor and Chairperson Elie Lam presents more logistics on what the Governor's Project is. The Governor's Project for this year is Culture for Caring which was a movement started by our District Governor Patel after Hurricane Harvey to promote care and

love. Every student should be able to feel loved and cared for at all times not just during times our hardship. He went over the requirements for obtaining a Governor's Project badge.

If an LTG fails to raise \$600 then they will not be able to attend DCON as a district board member. He gives a list of potential sponsors and tips and tricks on how to be successful at getting sponsorships. The next ad sale goal is \$400 total by October 31st. District Assistant Administrator Kelly Poland showed the sponsorship sales that board members have at present. She then showed the board how to access www.txokkiwanis.org and find out the contact information for Kiwanis as a resource to raise the complete \$600.

## Appendix B

Rules, Elections, and Credentials Committee



STRIKE Article III, Section 1, Subsection a, paragraph 1

Each Lt. Governor shall submit a set of monthly reports regarding his/her activity within his/her division(s) and assigned district committee work as outlined in the Texas-Oklahoma District Lt. Governor manual. The procedure for properly completing these reports will be outlined in the manual and at Lt. Governor-elect training. These reports shall be completed on the District Web Site at the Governor's discretion.

[Policy Code]

STRIKE Article II, Section 3, Subsection b

All elected and appointed members of the District Board, including Lt. Governor-elects, but excluding the District Editor and Convention Liaison, shall be Delegates-at-Large in the House of Delegates. They shall receive the same rights and privileges as all delegates.

[Code for Elections and HOD]

ADD Article I, Section 2, Subsection b, Paragraph 3

Candidates are required to submit all social media platforms on the Candidacy Form to be monitored and accessed by the Committee on Regulations, Elections, and Credentials throughout the duration of campaigning and the Leadership Education District Conference.

[Code for Elections and HOD]

ADD Article V, Section 6, Subsection j

The duties of a Lieutenant Governor shall be as follows:

j. Inform faculty advisors and/or officer candidates for the upcoming year of their potential duties and commitments to both their home club and the district, at large.

STRIKE and ADD Article V, Section 7, Subsection g

Produce and distribute a club officer directory for use of other club officers and District Board members, and update the list through Lieutenant Governors and District notifications mailings.

STRIKE and ADD Article VIII, Section 2

The District Governor or his/her designee shall notify mail to each club and the Administrator of Key Club International an official call to the annual convention at least thirty days prior to the convention.

STRIKE Article IX, Section 4, Subsection g

... In the event that a Lt. Governor is removed, then it shall be the responsibility of the Governor to notify, or appoint someone to notify, each club in that officer's division of the vacancy and the replacement officer for that vacancy. The officer's contact information shall be sent as well. All notifications should be sent in writing to each club within two weeks of the board's action. In the event of a vacancy in office, it shall be filled in accordance with the provisions as contained in Article IX, Sections 2 and 3 of these Bylaws.

ADD Article XIII, Section 3, Subsection b.i

Such proposed amendments may additionally be adopted by 3 District Officers, including Lieutenant Governors, in which case the amendment can be proposed as described in Article XIII, Section 3, Subsection a.
